First reminder: Official Catholic Directory (Kenedy Directory or OCD) – Despite the fact that it is only August, I am sending this “heads up” to all pastors:

The Official Catholic Directory (OCD) is now doing all changes to parishes, institutions and organizations, within each diocese, electronically. Sometime in the next few months you or a staff person will receive a notice via e-mail about the data being gathered for the directory. Please read the information carefully and follow the directions carefully as well. Last year, there were over 100 parishes, institutions or organizations that failed to do so and my office had to complete all of the information. There were times that an answer was a “guess” and we really should have accurate information being published. One area that was often left blank was the **contact person**, so the pastor was typically named if it was left blank. You will no longer submit this data to the Chancellor but rather send it directly to the OCD – again electronically. Once the deadline for submission has passed I will receive a notice to go online to approve information before publication. **I am unable to approve for submission if any of the areas are left blank.** So **PLEASE** fill out fully to the best of your knowledge. Integrity Guidelines no longer are being used although they offer some good guidelines. It has been replaced by the **Standards of Ministerial Behavior**. Visit the diocesan website for the updated policy and standards. The Diocese of Saint Cloud has an onsite audit this year. The auditors will be visiting some of the parishes.

Meanwhile, a few reminders about CCHD and this annual collection:

- Catholic Campaign for Human Development is the U.S. Catholic Bishops' anti-poverty initiative. It has helped fund community programs that address root causes of poverty since 1970.
- Today more than 40 million people in America are living below the poverty line; an average of 2.5 million children experience poverty and homelessness each year. The need is real!
- 75% of funds taken up in our parishes will help fund national grants that support organizations fighting against poverty, including several organizations within our diocese.
- The remaining 25% are kept right here in the diocese and are distributed to smaller, local organizations working to end poverty right in our backyard.

All divorced persons who want to now marry in the Catholic Church need an annulment. There are three different annulment processes to determine the validity/invalidity of marriage.

1. **Lack of Canonical Form** – this annulment process is used when a baptized Catholic marries without a dispensation from form in a setting other than a priest and two witnesses.
2. **Previous Bond** – this annulment procedure is used when a person enters a marriage with another who has been previously, presumably validly married and is not divorced.
3. **Formal Process** – this annulment procedure is used when a Catholic is married in a Catholic ceremony or a Protestant is married in a ceremony that is accepted by the state. [With the timely cooperation of the petitioner, this process is normally complete within twelve months.] **DO NOT SET A WEDDING DATE UNTIL THE ANNULMENT PROCESS IS COMPLETE.** It can take up to 9 months to be completed.

If you are uncertain about which annulment process should be petitioned for, you can call our office at (320) 251-6557 from 8:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

As of July 1, 2016, the Tribunal of the Diocese of St. Cloud no longer charges a set fee for annulments. Order of Baptism for Children --- Important Dates

- On November 14, 2017, the United States Bishops canonically approved the new translation of the *Order of Baptism of Children*. This included an Appendix which more clearly delineates the rite within Mass.
- On April 11, 2019, the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments approved and confirmed the revised text of the *Order of Baptism of Children*, On June 10, 2019 (the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church), Daniel Cardinal DiNardo, President of the USCCB, issued a Decree of Publication.
- In it, Cardinal DiNardo indicates that this rite may be used in the Liturgy as of February 2, 2020, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord.
- Its use is mandatory as of Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020. From that date forward, no other translation of the rite may be used in the dioceses of the United States.

At this writing, five publishers have expressed an interest in printing the new text -- Liturgical Press, Catholic Book, Liturgy Training Publications, Magnificat, and USCCB.

- Rite of Election – March 1, 2020
- Chrism Mass – April 2, 2020
- Confirmation of Adults – May 30, 2020

Immaculate Conception – December 9 – The Office of Worship has received several inquiries about the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. In the new Liturgical Year, the feast is transferred to Monday, December 9 and is non-obligatory. The Sundays of Advent have a higher ranking on the Liturgical Calendar, therefore, this feast is moved. Masses celebrated on December 9, should use the orations as prescribed for Immaculate Conception. Masses celebrated on December 7/8 should be for the Second Sunday of Advent.

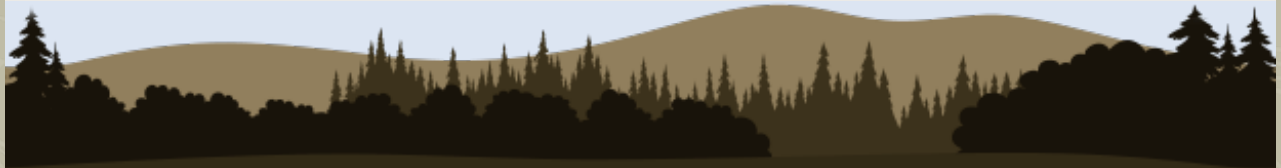
