## Faith Community of St. Agnes, St. Louis, St. Margaret

## 1.Who are we as an ACC?

- We are a three-parish cluster of St. Agnes in Roscoe (125 people), St. Margaret in Lake Henry (196 People), and St. Louis in Paynesville (1070 people) a total of 1391 parishioner.
- We have about 50% attendance from of our registered parishioners. We have many summer visitors that attend all three parishes.
- We are located on the southern/central edge of the diocese bordering the New Ulm Diocese. Our communities (especially Paynesville, the hub church) is quite ecumenical with a large ELCA Church, an active United Methodist, Assembly of God, Evangelical Free congregations, and some smaller Bible based churches.
- We have three Masses, one in each parish. All of them have crying babies. (young families)
- We have been served by Father Glenn for 15 years.
- We have 2 active weekly rosary groups that have about 40 people between the 2.
- Our religious education program has 235 students in grades 1-10. They meet on Wednesday afternoons and evenings.
- 2 active bible studies each with about 10 people in each one.
- We have 94 hours of weekly Eucharistic adoration
- We have many active volunteers. We have 40 extraordinary Eucharistic ministers and about 30 lectors and over 40 religious education teachers (including children's liturgy of the word during Sunday Mass)
- We serve approximately 40 at elder facilities.

- 1. What is one thing we are proud of as we build bridges with one another? Our parishioners cross borders in ministry and in church attendance.
- 2. Our biggest struggle was implementing change when our priest of 22 years retired. Father Glenn had to take a lot of guff, people got mad, quit and 15 years later they all got over it.
- 3. How are we listening? By being available in the hub town.
- 4. In what ways are we nurturing a Eucharistic Spirituality? Adoration (94 hours) Homebound communion/ and to the Assisted Living and Nursing Home, and our rosary groups.
- 5. How are we investing in the call and formation of leaders now and for the future? We have an active seminarian and a new priest that came out of our parishes in the past 5 years. Hannah has her graduate degree from St. John's through the YTM program and is a Master lay ecclesial minister, and have money allocated for continuing education for parishioners. 40 religion teachers that are being formed.
- 6. Our priority is to begin bereavement ministry in the early part of 2024.
