SCHOOLS



Saint Boniface Catholic School:

- 233 students enrolled in Pre-Kindergarten through 6th grade and 29 staff members.
- Originally built in 1916.
- St Boniface school system was started in 1916 was staffed with Benedictine Sisters.





Saints Peter & Paul Catholic School:

- 109 students in Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade and 16 staff members.
- In 1906, the Benedictine Sisters came to teach in the Saints Peter & Paul School.

We work together and have one principal for both schools that we share.

Built 1963 by Fr. Elmer Eisenschenk Encompasses a 70 bed Nursing Home, Memory Care Assisted Living Facility, Assisted Living Apartments, and subsidized living apartments.

Grasshopper Chapel Hill

- ► The Assumption Chapel, otherwise known as Grasshopper Chapel, is nestled among towering trees of the countryside that overlook Cold Spring, Minnesota. As a religious landmark, Assumption Chapel is visited by thousands of people each year who revel in the tranquility, beauty, and mystique of the grounds.
- After years of reconstruction, the Assumption Grasshopper Chapel remains in existence today. Celebration Masses, weddings, and other events take place throughout the year so everyone can experience the chapel as they please.
- ▶ In 1877, within the course of 24 hours, millions of grasshoppers destroyed the grain crops of farmers in the area. Also, honeycombed the countryside with eggs that hatched the following spring. It was, devastation beyond measure. The people of Cold spring prayed for 15 years to get rid of the grasshoppers.

- On March 22-24, some of the youth and two adults will be attending Castaway Retreat in Detroit Lakes.
- ▶ June 23-29th, twenty-two youth and six adults will be going on the Mission Trip to Fort Collins, Colorado
