



Good morning Your Excellency & Mrs. Kresky,

With a spirit of fresh optimism and encouragement, I am writing to share that the Holy Saints Area Catholic Community invites you to utilize our ACC to provide guidance & information analysis in the next steps in ACC development. You can see in the attached file a picture of the precise wording of this invitation as it was discussed, formed, presented, moved for approval, and and affirmed with near-unanimous support by a roll-call vote at our ACC Pastoral Council meeting this week (Tues, 3/28, 7-10:00pm).

Brenda can certainly detail for you as needed the lively discussion which led to the consensus and invitation. After Tuesday night, I feel that I have the support and encouragement of our Pastoral Council, as well as that of Fr. James Statz, to put our ACC at your immediate disposal. This is an offer, specifically, to assist you in efforts to address what we perceive as very serious and urgent needs in our ACC. Especially since these same needs seem to be ominously shared by our neighboring ACCs* and even ubiquitous throughout the Diocese.

I know I can speak for most, if not all who were present that a spirit of courage, openness, honesty permeated the council room accompanied by attentiveness and care for all the parishes and parishioners represented. Nothing of your future intentions was presumed, nor were they subject to speculation by HSACCPC attendees and members at our Tuesday meeting. Nevertheless, a strong desire was shared by many or all to be proactive and actively engaged in a process of identifying and creating solutions for the future success of all the faithful in our ACC in responding to our collective baptismal calling to holiness and apostolic missionary discipleship. It was recognized that actively initiating and openly inviting this dialog with you, the chief shepherd and spiritual father of our diocese, may quickly prove to be a first step up a
