

## **Transparency vs. Confidentiality**

In any communication process, especially one as important as the All Things New planning process, both transparency and confidentiality play key roles.

### **Key Differences**

#### **Purpose:**

Transparency is about being open and clear with the public about plans, processes and decisions.

Confidentiality is about keeping certain information private to protect individuals or the integrity of the process.

#### **Scope:**

Transparency involves sharing information that helps stakeholders understand the process and encourages their involvement.

Confidentiality involves withholding information that, if disclosed, could be harmful, misleading or inappropriate to share at a given time.

#### **Communication:**

Transparent communication is open, regular and accessible, ensuring that everyone is on the same page.

Confidential communication is selective, restricted and ensures that sensitive details remain private until they are ready or necessary to share.

### **Key Similarities**

**Trust-building:** Both transparency and confidentiality are essential in building trust within the community. While transparency fosters trust through openness, confidentiality ensures that sensitive matters are handled respectfully and securely.

**Contextual Application:** Both concepts must be applied thoughtfully. You cannot be entirely transparent with everything (some matters require confidentiality), just as you cannot be completely confidential if key stakeholders need certain information to make informed decisions.

Balanced Approach: Both are important in maintaining healthy communication. The challenge lies in finding the right balance between being open and honest (transparency) while protecting sensitive or private matters (confidentiality).

**How They Work Together:**

In a communication strategy like the All Things New planning process, transparency and confidentiality work together to maintain the trust and integrity of the process:

Transparency ensures that stakeholders are informed, engaged and united with the planning process.

Confidentiality ensures that sensitive issues or decisions are handled with care, protecting the privacy and security of individuals and the integrity of the planning work.

In practice, this means sharing relevant information and updates about the plan's progress (transparency) while withholding sensitive or unconfirmed details until it's appropriate to share (confidentiality). Both principles should guide the communication strategy, ensuring that information is shared in the right way at the right time.
